Pastor's Pen



Catholic Schools Week:

This week we will celebrate once again the gift that each of our parochial schools is for our students, for us and for our faith future. Those of you who attended Catholic schools in the years past are surely grateful for all that you learned there, both practical and religious. And to all of you here at St. Peter's who support our school, I say a great, big "Thank you." It is through your generosity that we are able to maintain our school and give to our youngest parish members a unique understanding of the Catholic faith. All of us stand on the shoulders of those who've gone before us. To them and for them let us lift up a silent prayer of thanks.

One of the essential marks of a school's Catholic identity, according to Archbishop Robert Carlson of St. Louis, is that "a Catholic worldview is reflected in everything that is taught or offered to students experientially." We Catholics see the world through the lens of divine revelation. We believe that God has reached out and communicated to us the meaning of the world (all things visible and invisible). We also believe that God made us human beings in his image and likeness and that He teaches us who we are as His children, the stewards of His creation. When we teach math or science, history or literature, we teach from the perspective of men and women who believe in a good God who cares about His creation and who loves us, His children. A Catholic school teaches about God even if His name is not mentioned.

A secular worldview would suggest that the universe and everything in it is the result of a cosmic accident. We disagree. We teach that all things (spiritual and material) are the result of God's loving plan. Our Catholic worldview is populated by women and men who have gone before us. We call them saints. We name our parishes and schools after them - to remind us that they are praying for us and working to help us grow in wisdom, holiness and service to our communities.

Yes, Catholic schools and especially St. Peter's school reflect a passion for the truth that sets us free from all forms of political, cultural, or amoral slavery (what Pope Benedict has called the "dictatorship of relativism").

St. Peter, please pray for us, especially for students.

Stewardship

In today's Gospel we hear proclaimed the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. He teaches. He heals. All are amazed.

By their baptism, Christian stewards realize they are called to do the same in their lives. They are called to be the light of Christ each day.

As we bring closure to the beginning of this new year, now is a good time to ask the Lord to fill our hearts with courage and faith, so that we too may publicly minister in his name; that we may be liberated from our insecurities and fear so that we can share the Gospel authoritatively and work to heal at least one wounded relationship in the coming months ahead.

Word of Life

HHS's new mandate for contraception/sterilization coverage ... includes an incredibly narrow exemption for "religious employers" that protects almost no one. For example, a Catholic institution serving the poor and needy would have to fire its non-Catholic staff, refuse life-affirming care to non-Catholic people in need, and devote itself instead to "the inculcation of religious values" to qualify for the exemption. Individuals, insurers, and the sponsors of non-employee health plans (e.g., student health plans in Catholic schools) would have no exemption at all. This effort to corral religion exclusively into the sanctuaries of houses of worship betrays a complete ignorance of the role of religion in American life, and of Congress's long tradition of far more helpful laws on religious freedom.
